Workshop held in June 2013 in Houston

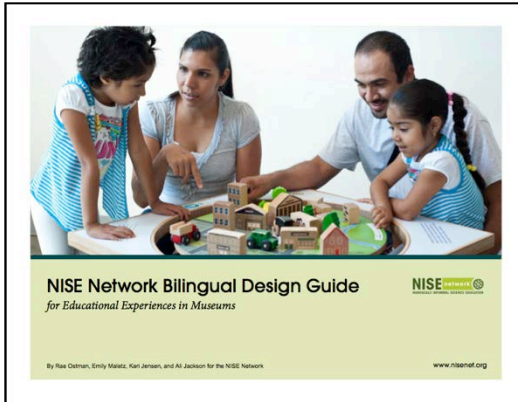
- Explored importance of engaging bilingual audiences in nanoscale science, engineering and technology

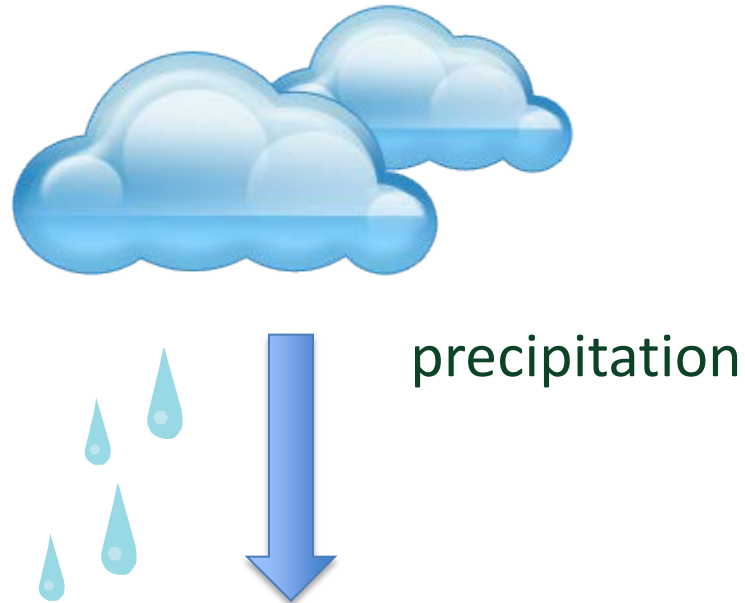
Make it multi-sensory.

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- Include manipulatives and motion.

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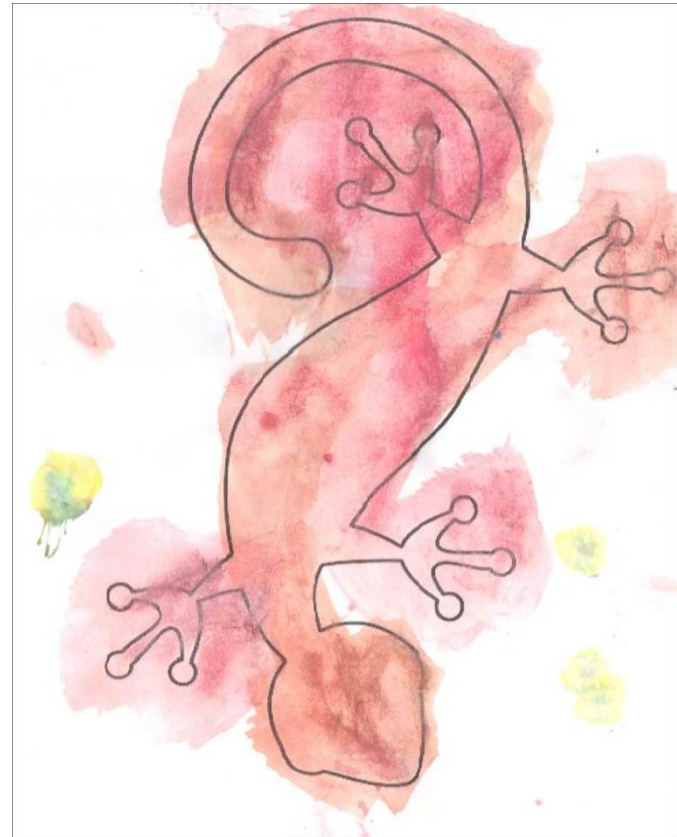
- Reveal objects, people, and vocabulary as they become relevant.

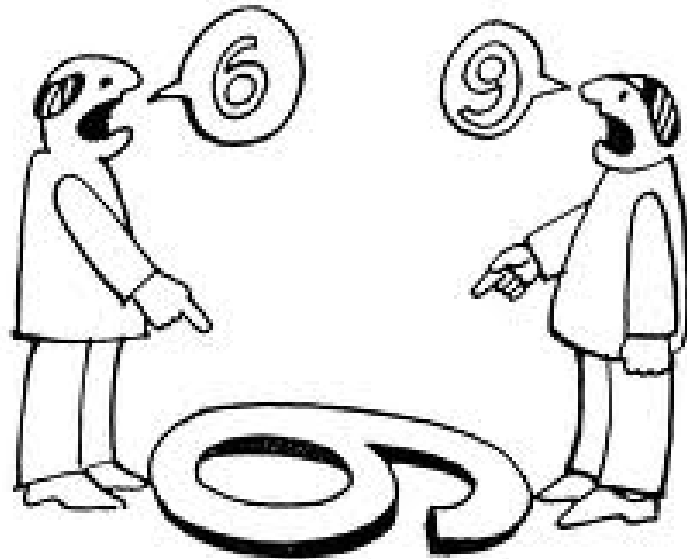
