

# ¡Veo, veo nano!

1. Cada jugador escoge un tablero de juego.
2. Coloca el juego de baraja en el centro con el lado morado hacia arriba (la figura hacia abajo).
3. Lee la oración de cada carta y después voltéala.
4. Mira los objetos en la carta. Cada uno de los tableros de juego tiene uno de estos objetos.
5. Todos los jugadores buscan en sus tableros para encontrar un objeto idéntico al objeto en la carta.
6. La primera persona que encuentre su objeto dice “¡Nano!” y toma la carta.
7. El juego continúa con la siguiente carta, hasta que no quede ni una sola en la pila central.
8. ¡El que se quede con más cartas gana!
